Update – Canadian Vaccination Mandate

November 8, 2021.

This announcement is for information purposes only, for CSPA skydivers and dropzones.

For Skydivers and Tandem Passengers

Starting October 30, 2021 at 03:00 EDT: if you're 12 years of age plus 4 months, or older, you'll need to be fully vaccinated in order to board a domestic or international flights departing from **designated airports** in Canada. This means if you are skydiving from a dropzone located at a designated airport, Transport Canada requires you to be fully vaccinated.

Warning!

This list of airports may evolve over the coming weeks and months. If you don't see a small airport listed, it may be included in travel from remote communities.

For employees of dropzones:

As of October 30, employers in the federally regulated air transportation sector will be required to establish vaccination policies for their organizations. Specifically, the vaccination requirement will apply to airlines and airports, and other organizations (dropzones) who have employees who enter restricted areas of airports, such as concession and hospitality workers. This may apply to some dropzones that operate out of municipal airports.

The CSPA strongly encourages all dropzones to verify with their local airport authority to see if those requirements apply.

In brief, If you are a 702 operator out of an airport that is not on the list, the federal vaccine mandate does not apply. The masks requirements are still in place for all occupants of aircraft except in the cockpit. Other provincial requirements and restrictions might also vary from one province to the other.
